Research study into the future of fieldwork in Higher Education

Information sheet for survey participants - students

28 July 2021

Background

We are a staff and student team of researchers who lead the [Enhancing Fieldwork Learning](http://www.enhancingfieldwork.org.uk) pedagogic research project. The EFL project was originally undertaken as part of the National Teaching Fellowship Scheme managed by the Higher Education Academy between 2010 and 2013 and has since run with support from the British Ecological Society and other funders.

Why are we doing this study?

We are interested in exploring the future of fieldwork teaching and learning in Higher Education. Therefore, we are conducting a research study into the changes to fieldwork teaching in HE that may happen over the next few years.

What is the purpose of the study?

There have been considerable impacts on our society and education system recently due to a range of factors. Looking ahead as our Higher Education system continues to adapt;

- What can fieldwork experiences contribute towards the education of our undergraduates?
- How can we maximise the benefits provided by this teaching and learning approach?
- What is the optimal way to deliver the best fieldwork experience for all students?

Who would we like to participate in the study?

We would like to gather the thoughts of two key groups:

1. Current undergraduates – via an online survey
2. HE practitioners – via conversations at the EFL Showcase in Sept 2021 and follow up interviews

How can you be involved?

Students – to take part you can answer a short online survey that should take around 10 minutes to complete. There are several questions that ask about how you value fieldwork in your degree course and the form in which you would like it to be delivered. There are also questions that ask about skills development, funding and the sustainability of fieldtrips.

Do I have to take part?

You are under no obligation to participate, and you do not need to complete and submit the survey once started if you wish to withdraw.

Confidentiality, storage and disposal of information

If you submit a complete survey response, your answers will remain confidential, and we will ensure that only anonymous results are reported/published. Participation is voluntary and you have the right to withdraw your data until the 29th October (please send an email to a.l.mauchline@reading.ac.uk). After this point the data will be analysed and prepared for publication. The data will be stored on password-protected University computer file storage and the raw data will be deleted once the paper is published.

One name will be selected at random from the list of completed surveys on the 29th October 2021. The winner will be contacted by email shortly after this date. The results of the study will be combined with the responses from the staff survey and written up for publication in a pedagogic research journal.
